



Student Dress Code

The wearing of school uniform is required by all students.

- It easily identifies students at school

- Students are not discriminated against in relation to the quality or fashion of their clothes
- Our uniform provides sun protection
- Uniforms are hard wearing and practical in design, lasting the school year or even longer

Ready-made and second-hand uniforms and accessories are available for purchase from our Uniform Shop which operates in A Block. The time of opening is advertised in the Banter.

Uniform

- School green polo shirt (Year 6 students may wear their Senior Shirt)
- School green skorts/shorts (grey boys' shorts are being phased out starting with all Prep 2020 students in green shorts)
- School green soft-sided all round brim hat - worn for all outdoor activities - please label
- White socks and black shoes or any colour sports joggers
- School green jacket or jumper – please label
- School green tracksuit pants – please label
- School green tights
- School green long sleeve undershirts
- School green polo shirts for extra sun protection or warmth
- School green religious/cultural items (e.g. hijab, yarmulke, turban)
- Students are encouraged to use the official Brookfield State School bag

Music Uniform

- Long black pants and short-sleeved white shirt
- Green cummerbund and green crossover tie for girls or black bow tie for boys (provided)
- Black shoes and socks
- Hair neat and tidy with long hair tied back with (optional) green ribbon

Sports Uniform

Worn by children in Years 4-6 on Fridays and for sports carnivals

- School green/gold sport shirt
- School green shorts
- School sports cap - worn during representative events only, including Friday interschool sport

Sports House Shirts

Each child is assigned to a Sports House and encouraged to wear the relevant House Shirt for Inter-House Carnivals held each term. Sports Houses are Mackellar (Blue), Paterson (Green) and Lawson (Yellow).

Hair and Accessories

- Hair should be neat, tidy, natural coloured and tied back if long
- Students are permitted to wear one pair of small earrings, one watch, medical alert jewellery
- Make up and nail polish is not permitted
